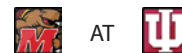

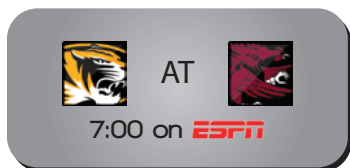

## PLAYER SPOTLIGHT

### SKAI MOORE

*Sophomore Linebacker*

This game is likely to come down to what happens when South Carolina's defense is on the field, and sophomore linebacker Skai Moore will be crucial to deciding that. Moore seems to be around the football more than any other USC defender this season, and it's showing up on the stat sheets, where his 28 tackles are the most on the team. Fifteen of those tackles have come in the last two games, with Moore racking up a career-high 10 tackles in the victory over Georgia. USC will depend on Moore to counter Missouri quarterback Maty Mauk's mobility. If he can neutralize the multi-talented redshirt sophomore quarterback's impact on the rushing game, it will make things much simpler for the rest of the defense and take some pressure off USC's offense to score on every possession.



## KNOW YOUR OPPONENT

### MATY MAUK

*(RS) Sophomore Quarterback*

The Gamecocks saw Mauk last season when he started in place of the injured James Franklin. Now, Mauk is the undisputed leader of the Tiger offense. He leads the SEC with 14 passing touchdowns and is averaging over 243 yards per game through the air. If the Gamecocks force him from the pocket, Mauk can make plays with his legs. He's totaled 115 rushing yards through Missouri's first four games.



## VEGAS REPORT

The Wynn in Las Vegas opened USC as a 7-point home favorite over Missouri early Sunday evening. The line dropped to 5 on Tuesday, before moving back up to 6 on Wednesday and Thursday. The total for 'over/under' wagers started at 63 on Wednesday, but was down to 61.5 early Thursday afternoon.

## PREDICTIONS

### Wes Mitchell

There's no doubt the Gamecocks are again going to have to put up big points to win this one. It's back to defending the spread offense for Carolina after two weeks against pro-style offenses. It's hard to go against the Gamecocks at home, even with the struggles on defense.

### Rixon Lane

South Carolina's offense has been clicking and Dylan Thompson's decision-making has improved with each game. I look for the Gamecock defense to give up plenty of yards, but tighten up in the red zone. Elliott Fry may prove to be the difference.

Although this is a new rivalry, I have a feeling these teams will keep it close more often than not. Mauk doesn't quite have the weapons he had last year, which means Dylan & Co. will dictate the pace at home.

### Aaron Weiss

It's going to be an old-fashioned shootout between Dylan Dog and The Marvelous Mauk, as both teams will come out looking to see whose is bigger, so to speak. Whoever throws the last interception will lose.

## BLT PASTA SALAD: ANOTHER KIND OF INSTANT CLASSIC FOR TAILGATERS

### BLT PASTA SALAD

LET'S GET COOKING!

Last year's game against Missouri was an instant classic. My husband and I still enjoy watching the occasional rebroadcasts of the game, even though we know – or perhaps because we know – what the outcome ultimately will be.

When we recently tasted this BLT Pasta Salad, we decided it was an instant classic for tailgating. The “BLT” in the name is the same BLT combo we love in sandwiches – bacon, lettuce and tomato – but here, they're combined with corkscrew pasta and turned into a winner of a side dish. I'm thinking that if you wanted to make it really hearty – a meal in a bowl – you could add some chopped rotisserie chicken to the salad and be good to go.

Here's hoping you and your fellow tailgaters enjoy the recipe. And here's hoping as well that if we have to have another nail-biting, heart-stopping, down-to-the-wire, come-from-behind, overtime instant classic of a game with Missouri, it'll turn out just like the last one.

### INGREDIENTS

- 16 oz. corkscrew-shaped pasta
- ½ cup milk (skim is fine)
- 8 slices bacon
- 1 sweet onion, diced
- 1 pint grape tomatoes, halved
- 1 tbsp. fresh thyme leaves
- 1 clove garlic, minced
- Kosher salt
- Freshly ground black pepper
- 1 cup mayonnaise
- ½ cup sour cream
- 4 tbsp. chopped fresh chives
- 5 cups chopped romaine lettuce

### DIRECTIONS

Cook the pasta in a large pot of boiling salted water as directed on the package. Drain well, then toss with the milk in a large bowl. Set aside.

Meanwhile, cook the bacon in a large skillet over medium-high heat until crisp. Drain on paper towels. Discard all but about 3 or 4 tablespoons of drippings from the pan. Add the onion and saute until light golden brown and tender. Add the tomatoes, thyme and garlic to the pan and stir gently until warmed through. Season with salt and pepper to taste. Add to pasta in the bowl.

Crumble all but 2 slices of the bacon into bite-size pieces, then add to the pasta mixture. Toss gently.

Combine the mayo, sour cream and chives in a small bowl, then add to the pasta and toss until evenly mixed. Add the chopped lettuce and toss again; adjust salt and pepper if needed. Spoon into a serving bowl, then crumble remaining bacon and sprinkle on top. Best served at room temperature. Makes 8-10 side-dish servings.
