Senior receiver Damiere Burd hasn't had the season he or most anuone, for that matter - expected. Through five games, he has just four catches, though two of them went for touchdowns, and 114 yards. And his involvement in USC's offense has declined since he caught 33 passes for 575 yards and four touchdowns a year ago. Fortunately for Byrd, the Gamecocks' next opponent has had trouble stopping him. The speedy wideout caught five passes for 98 yards and a touchdown in a victory over Kentucky last season, the bulk of it coming on a play where he scorched the Wildcats' secondary for a 62yard score. Byrd also totaled 69 yards and a touchdown against Kentucky in his first two seasons at USC, and will look to kick his senior campaign into gear in Lexington against the Wildcats, who rank third in the conference in passing defense.

VEGAS REPORT

The Wynn in Las Vegas opened South Carolina as a 10-point favorite, but it adjusted the number down to 7.5 in less than two hours. By lunch in the Eastern time zone on Monday, the line was seven and went down to six by 2 p.m. USC was favored by 5.5 or five by Monday night. Since then, the line has wavered at various spots between 4.5, five and 5.5. The total was released at 55 late Tuesday night. Gamblers can take the Wildcats on the money line for a +175 return (risk \$100 to win \$175)

PLUFF MUD BROWNIES

WHEN YOU NEED A SWEET ENDING, PLUFF MUD BROWNIES ARE THE WAY TO GO

Let's make this short and sweet: Last week's game didn't leave a very good taste in anybody's mouth. In the spirit of moving in a new direction, this week's tailgating recipe heads over to the sweet side of the table. These Pluff Mud Brownies are pure, frosted, marshmallow-fluff-filled decadence. They take their name from the thick, gooey mud that is a trademark of the South Carolina Lowcountry's waterways.

These brownies are great to have around during the fourth quarter, either to soothe your sorrows or (let's hope) celebrate a big finish.

DABO OF THE WEEK



"I see someone else is a fan of extra starch in their polos!"

INGREDIENTS

2 sticks butter, at room temp. 2 cups sugar

1/3 cup unsweetened cocoa powder

4 eggs

1 tsp. vanilla extract

1½ cups all-purpose flour

1 cup chopped pecans

- lightly toasted (optional)

1 (7-oz.) jar marshmallow fluff

DIRECTIONS

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Grease a jellyroll pan (about 15x10x1 inches). To make the brownies: In a large bowl, use an electric mixer to cream together the butter and the sugar, then beat in the cocoa, eggs, vanilla and flour. Stir in the nuts. Spread the mixture (it will be very thick) in the prepared pan and bake for 25 minutes. Remove from oven and let cool on a wire rack for 10 minutes, then, while brownies are still warm, spread all the marshmallow fluff over the top. Let stand until completely cool.

Meanwhile, make the frosting: In a large mixing bowl, using an electric mixer, blend the butter, cocoa, vanilla and 1/3 cup of the milk. Gradually beat in the powdered sugar, beating until the frosting is thick and smooth. Add the remaining milk slowly if needed; the frosting should be thick but still spreadable. Stir in the nuts. Spread the frosting over the brownies. Cut into larger squares (about 3x3) to serve on plates, or cut smaller to eat out of hand.

FUNGUIDE LIGHTEN THINGS UP

GAMECOCK STAFF CONTEMPLATES USING PHAROH COOPER AT EVERY POSITION

In an effort to light a spark under his team, USC head coach Steve Spurrier told assembled reporters today that he's contemplating using Pharoh Cooper at every position on the field.

"We've tried him at wide receiver, quarterback and punt returner, but obviously we're sitting here with two losses," Spurrier said. "But anyway, we might need to see what he can do at tight end, running back, right guard or center, also."

Defensive coordinator Lorenzo Ward later added that "we took a long look at him at Mike linebacker during practice this morning. We want our playmakers on the field."

Ward noted that the defensive staff had also given Cooper some practice reps at weakside linebacker, spur, both safety spots, defensive end and cornerback.

"We probably won't use him at defensive tackle because we do want to keep him fresh," Ward said.

When asked if Cooper, who has been nursing a nagging injury, would be unable to go this week against Kentucky, Spurrier said in such a scenario that Cooper would have a role in sideline reporting for the Gamecock Radio Network and may also be calling plays for both the offense and defense.

STOOPS ADMITS HE WAS SURPRISED TO LEARN UK WAS IN SEC WHEN HE TOOK JOB

EPIDEMIC OF HUGGING PLAGUES MALES IN SOUTH CAROLINA



In the wake of USC's shocking, last-minute loss to Missouri last week, men of all ages throughout the state of South Carolina have begun hugging to console each other.

"We don't know what to do to stop it," said Dr. Carter Huggins of the Center for Disease Control. "It's not just fathers hugging sons or brothers hugging brothers, it's everybody. Should South Carolina lose this weekend in Lexington, we may not be able to turn back the tide on this disease."

"I walked into my office on Monday and hugged my boss for about a minute," said Steve Wilson, an employee at a technology company in Myrtle Beach. "And I hate my boss. He just looked so sad. I was sad, too. It just felt like the right thing to do."

An Associated Press poll this week found that eight in 10 males throughout the state reported hugging someone on Sunday or Monday this week, and that 95 percent of them had never hugged another human being before.

University of Kentucky head coach Mark Stoops told an ESPN Radio team earlier this week that he was stunned to learn the Wildcats were in the Southeastern Conference when he arrived in Lexington to accept the head coaching job.

"I got to the press conference announcing my hiring, and I was so excited to finally be a head coach," Stoops said. "Then I was walking up to the podium and noticed an SEC logo behind the dais. It was shocking."

Stoops said he leaned over and whispered to the UK athletic director to confirm that Kentucky was indeed a member of the SEC.

"It was too late to run at that point, but obviously this wasn't what I expected," Stoops said. "Looking at their highlights over the years and seeing the team, fans, atmosphere and everything else, I thought this program was in the MAC or maybe the American Athletic Conference. Never in my wildest dreams did I think I was going to be playing eight SEC teams every year."

"The goal was just to become a head coach and then parlay it into a real job somewhere like SMU or San Jose State or something," Stoops continued. "I need to research these opportunities a little more carefully from now on."
