

The Rebels are a perfect 7-0 and eyeing a spot in the inaugural College Football Playoff, having knocked off such teams as Alabama and Texas A&M. But Ole Miss will need to survive a night in Death Valley to keep those hopes alive. No. 24 LSU's CFP hopes were dashed by a home loss to Mississippi State and an embarrassing blowout defeat at Auburn, but the Tigers have since climbed back into the top 25 with consecutive victories over Florida and Kentucky. Ole Miss has looked like one of the country's top teams thus far, but LSU hasn't lost twice at home in a single season in six years. It'll be tough sledding for the Rebels in Death Valley. If you're looking for a high-scoring affair, look elsewhere.



BRISON WILLIAMS

Senior Defensive Back

Brison Williams has been the heart and soul of South Carolina's defense this season. He moved to cornerback from safety over the offseason to fill a team need, and he's been nothing but solid since. Opposing quarterbacks think twice before throwing the ball in his direction, but he has a team-leading five pass break-ups and an interception nonetheless. He's also taken USC's freshman defensive backs under his wing, teaching them the tools of the trade and helping them through some tough times. But for USC to keep Auburn's offense in check, Williams and his teammates in the secondary must play their best game yet. The Tigers don't throw it often, but there's big-play potential when they do. USC's corners will have their hands full trying to fluster Auburn quarterback Nick Marshall, and they'll need to help the front seven stop the Tigers' read-option rushing game. Williams, as he has so far this season, will have to set the tone.


KNOW YOUR OPPONENT

VEGAS REPORT

Auburn opened as a 14-point home favorite over South Carolina, but the line moved to 16 within an hour. By late Monday afternoon, most spots were up to 17.5 or 18. As of Friday morning, the consensus line was Auburn by 19, and most betting shops had a total of 65.5 points for 'over/under' wagers.



LET'S GET COOKING!

SLOW-COOKER RIBS CAN BE CUSTOMIZED WITH YOUR FAVORITE BBQ SAUCE

It's great to come home at the end of a long day at work and open the door to the fragrance of beef short ribs bubbling away in the slow cooker. But there's one thing that's even better: being around the house all day while they're cooking so you can enjoy the increasingly tantalizing aroma and anticipate the great supper to come.

These tender short ribs are perfect when you're tailgating at home on an "away" Saturday like this one. If you put them in the slow cooker in the late morning or around lunchtime, they'll be ready by the time the Gamecocks kick it off on The Plains. We've tried a couple of different barbecue sauces for this recipe, always with great results. (The recipe originally came from Kraft, so it recommends that company's products, but Sweet Baby Ray's sauces are nice, too.)

If you're hosting a crowd for the game, just wait 'til the smell of these ribs hits 'em when they walk in the door.

SLOW-COOKER BEEF SHORT RIBS

INGREDIENTS

- 5 lbs . beef short ribs
- 2 lg. onions, coarsely chopped
- ¼ cup all-purpose flour
- 1 cup barbecue sauce
- (your favorite)
- ¼ cup honey
- 1 tbsp. yellow mustard

DIRECTIONS



Place the ribs in the slow cooker and spread the chopped onions evenly on top. In a small bowl, combine the rest of the ingredients, whisking until any flour lumps disappear. Pour the sauce mixture on top of the ribs and onions. Put the lid on the slow cooker and cook on low for 6-8 hours or on high for 3-4 hours.

Remove the ribs from the cooker to a platter and cover to keep warm. Skin excess fat from the sauce, then return the ribs to the cooker. Stir gently until evenly coated, then serve. Makes 6-8 servings.

GAMECOCK FANS UNITE, AGREE IT'S TOO SOON TO MAKE FUN OF AUBURN'S TREES

In a rare display of unity, South Carolina fans came together this week to declare that it's simply too soon for them to poke fun at the demise of Auburn University's famed oak trees at Toomer's Corner. The oak trees stretched majestically to the sky for decades on Auburn's campus and became a symbol of Tiger victories until they were tragically poisoned by an Alabama fan in 2011.

"I'd really planned on teasing one of my Auburn buddies this week about them being so infatuated with trees and leaves and bark," said Art Jones, a Gamecock Club member since 1979. "I mean, it's one thing to be infatuated with livestock, like Clemson fans are. But trees? Then I realized my heart just wasn't in it."

His eyes misting, Jones wiped a tear away before adding: "Those were just innocent trees, man. They never hurt anybody."

Gary Olson, who's been attending games at Williams-Brice Stadium since boyhood, agreed.

"I just don't have a go-to jab for my Auburn friends right now," a visibly frustrated Olson said. "They won a national championship and played for another one in the last four years. And the trees? I couldn't possibly go there right now. It's just an impossible situation."

Olson added that he would "more than likely" tease his Auburn pals for being "farmers and rednecks – you know, all the stuff people have been teasing them about for 100 years," but that he knew the jokes were unoriginal and didn't feel good about it.

GAMECOCKS LOOKING INTO JOE MONTANA'S REMAINING ELIGIBILITY

Seeking an older, more seasoned roster of players, USC coach Steve Spurrier announced he'd check with the NCAA this week to see if Joe Montana had any college eligibility remaining.

"We've got 27-year-old Michael Washington playing significant minutes right now, and a few years ago we had Pops Frisby out there catching passes at 40," said Spurrier. "Maybe there's a formula there. Shoot, we've given these young guys all kinds of opportunities, and they haven't performed."

The 58-year-old Montana was in his mid-30s and playing in Super Bowls for the San Francisco 49ers when current Gamecock quarterback Dylan Thompson was born. That doesn't dissuade Spurrier. "We've tried just about everything," he said. "If these 18- and 19-year-old dudes can't get it done, let's run some old rascals out there. Why not?"
