

SEC PLAYER YOU SHOULD KNOW

While most eyes will be on the SEC West matchup between Mississippi State and Alabama, the SEC East picture will be much clearer after this weekend.

Georgia, which is still probably the best team in the division, can lock in a 6-2 record with a victory over rival Auburn and put a ton of pressure on Missouri (4-1 SEC) to win out if it's going to make its second straight trip to Atlanta. Missouri will struggle to make it through the weekend, much less the season, without another loss as it faces a rejuvenated Texas A&M squad. Florida (4-3 SEC) technically hasn't been eliminated from the race, but that would change Saturday with a Georgia win or a Florida loss. Georgia holds the tiebreaker over Missouri, but the Gators' surprise win over the Bulldogs gives them the tiebreaker there.



Mississippi State is possibly the best all-around team in college football, but nobody wants to play Bama. PLAYER SPOTLIGHT

J.T. SURRATT

Senior Defensive Tackle

Someone's got to plug the holes in South Carolina's leaky defense, and it has to start with redshirt senior defensive tackle J.T. Surratt. Surratt told everyone who would listen at SEC Media Days this summer that the Gamecocks' recent defensive line prowess would continue in 2014, even after USC lost No. 1 NFL Draft pick Jadeveon Clowneu and two other starters on the line over the offseason. But Surratt's words have proven hollow thus far, as the Gamecocks have the SEC's worst rushing defense through nine games, allowing roughly 223 yards per game. A trip to Gainesville, Florida, home of the SEC's sixth-best rushing attack - the Gators average about 206 yards per game on the ground - only spells more trouble. If USC is to escape the Swamp with a victory - and avoid falling two games under .500 - it will be because someone in the front seven refused to lie down and take another beating. Surratt has proven to be one of the few leaders on USC's defense. If he doesn't come to play, who will?



The Wynn in Las Vegas opened Florida as a 4.5-point home favorite for Saturday's SEC showdown vs. South Carolina. After the number moved to five within an hour, the betting shop had the Gators favored by 5.5 before midnight Eastern on Sunday. By early Monday afternoon, the line was up to 6.5. The Wynn, along with most other books, moved it to seven shortly after lunch on Wednesday. As of Wednesday, the total for 'over/under' bets was 58.5. For money-line wagers, UF is a -280 'chalk' and USC is the +240 underdog (bet \$100 to win \$240 if USC wins outright).

Harris threw for a career-high 215 yards last weekend in a 34-10 victory over Vanderbilt and has helped Florida keep its SEC East hopes alive. He started hot, completing seven of his first eight passes, against the Commodores. A dual-threat quarterback, Harris also rushed for a pair of touchdowns in the game. South Carolina is fresh off allowing a record-setting rushing performance to Tennessee QB Josh Dobbs. Harris will try to do the same.

LET'S GET COOKING!

EASY, CHEESY DIP RECIPE GIVES A NOD TO THE HOLY CITY

Sometimes the name of a recipe pretty much demands that you try it. "Better-Than-Sex Cake" is one – it really made the rounds (so to speak) in the late 1990s. "Beer Butt Chicken" is another recipe name that makes you think, "OK, we gotta try this." Then there's "Chicken with 40 Cloves of Garlic." That couldn't be right, could it? Actually, it is right, and it's delicious.

Well, the other day I saw a recipe named for my hometown. That doesn't happen every day, even when that town is Charleston, which lately seems to win some kind of tourism industry award about once a week – so it was pretty much a done deal I'd be making the recipe for one of our tailgates. It's called Charleston Cheese Dip. Trisha Yearwood, the country singer, is also a cookbook author and has her own show on the Food Network, and the recipe is hers.

CHARLESTON CHEESE DIP

INGREDIENTS

- ½ cup mayonnaise
- 8-oz. package cream cheese
 softened
- 1 cup sharp cheddar cheese - grated
- ½ cup Monterey Jack cheese - arated
- 2 green onions finely chopped
- 1 dash cayenne pepper
- 10 butter crackers (ex. Ritz)
 crushed
- 8 slices bacon - cooked & crumbled
- Corn chips/crackers/etc.for serving

As a lifelong Lowcountry resident, I didn't see anything that immediately shouted "Charleston" when I scanned the ingredient list – but it turned out that Yearwood was visiting the Holy City, tasted a really good cheese dip at a hotel and decided to try to copy it. In addition to being delicious, it's as simple as can be to put together. The ingredients are common ones, so you might have everything on hand already without making a special trip to the store. For a big crowd, I think the recipe would double well but might take a few minutes longer to bake.





DIRECTIONS

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Spray a shallow baking dish, such as a 9-inch pie pan, with nonstick spray.

In a medium bowl, blend the mayo, cream cheese, cheddar, Monterey Jack, green onions and cayenne pepper. Transfer the mixture to the baking dish. Sprinkle the cracker crumbs evenly on top and bake until heated through, about 15 minutes. Remove the pan from the oven and top with the bacon. Serve immediately with corn chips, crackers or bagel chips. Makes about 2 cups.





MUSCHAMP ABLE TO ORDER PIZZA FOR FIRST TIME IN OVER A YEAR

Florida head coach Will Muschamp told reporters that he'd recently been able to order delivery pizza from his favorite Gainesville restaurant for the first time in nearly a year and a half.

"They kept hanging up on me throughout the entire season last year," Muschamp said. "I tried to order from them again the day after Missouri beat us last month, and they told me the only types of pizza toppings available were razor blades and broken glass."

After a surprise victories over Georgia and Vanderbilt, Muschamp says the restaurant actually cold-called him directly and offered to feed his entire family for the next six months.

FLORIDA STUDENTS ANNOUNCE MEDIA MISHEARD THEM DURING MISSOURI GAME

The Florida Student Gator Club held a press conference Monday in an attempt to clarify what the student section chanted during the Gators' home game against Missouri last month.

"Let it be unequivocally clear – the media misreported what our student section was chanting at the end of the Missouri game," said Student Gator Club President Greg Walker, referencing Florida's 42-13 home loss to the Tigers in October. "It was widely reported that we were chanting 'Fire Muschamp!' This is 100 percent false. The reality is that we were chanting 'Hire Muschamp!"

"I've got six boxes of sausage and mushroom in my fridge right now," he said. "I think there's eight or nine containers of Caesar salad in there, too. Things have changed around here."

Muschamp added that he was relieved to finally be able to order pizza in Gainesville again because he'd had to resort to hiring a man to visit local Subways and pick up food for him.

"I've eaten more five-dollar footlongs in the last year than anyone should be expected to eat," he said.



Florida fans have suddenly embraced the embattled Muschamp after the Gators shocked archrival Georgia in Jacksonville. When asked why the students were chanting to hire a coach that was in fact hired four years ago, Walker said "The point was, hey, let's don't just hire this guy once. Let's keep hiring him every offseason as a way to show him how much we want to keep him here."
