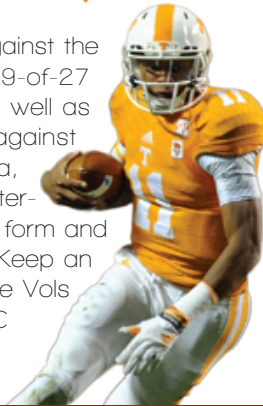

Arkansas is fresh off its first SEC victory under head coach Bret Bielema. Both teams have been dealt a few blows this season, but they'll each have something on the line in Fayetteville this weekend. A loss for Ole Miss would add yet another stain to what was shaping up to be a dream season.

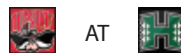

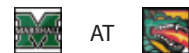

### DAVID WILLIAMS

*Freshman Running Back*

South Alabama is simply not good enough to contend with South Carolina for four quarters. So what happens when USC builds a sizable lead and wants to grind out the clock? The same thing that happened over a month ago when the Gamecocks blew out Furman, 41-10: Redshirt freshman tailback David Williams gets to carry the rock. Williams rushed 11 times for 110 yards - his first time passing the century mark - and caught a pass for 14 yards against Furman in October. After rushing three times for 8 yards and picking up a crucial third-and-short conversion in overtime against Florida, he'll be hungry to get on the field on Saturday. Given that tailbacks Mike Davis and Brandon Wilds could both leave early for the NFL after this season, Saturday's game could offer just another glimpse at the Gamecocks' offense of the future, one that seems more and more likely to feature Williams as its centerpiece.

### VEGAS REPORT

For most of the week, South Carolina's home finale Saturday vs. South Alabama was off the board. That's because Jaguars' quarterback Brandon Bridge's status has been unknown. As of late Thursday night, Bridge was still considered 'doubtful.' Nevertheless, the Westgate SuperBook in Las Vegas finally opened South Carolina as a 25.5-point home favorite early Thursday morning. The total for 'over/under' wagers started at 56. As of late Thursday night, most spots had adjusted the line for the side by one point, as USC was favored by 24.5 points. The total remained at 56. A few offshore shops, most likely 5Dimes, will post a money-line number at some point. I would think the Jaguars will be available at around 30/1 or 35/1 to win outright.

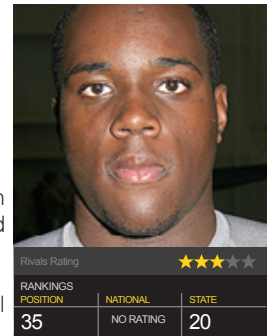

Thanksgiving is just about here, and as Gamecock fans we can all add last weekend's win to the list of things for which we're grateful. This week's recipe has a little celebration and gratitude in it, too – and the taste of fall as well.

Pumpkin Cream Cheese Bars are as easy to make as pumpkin pie but also have the added richness of a pumpkin cheesecake. Be sure to allow them time to chill and firm up before you slice and serve them. I added a little spice to the original Taste of Home magazine recipe, in the form of ground ginger and cinnamon, just to amp up the flavor a touch. I sprinkled a bit of cinnamon on top, too.

## PUMPKIN CREAM CHEESE BARS

### INGREDIENTS

#### CRUST

- ¼ cup sugar
- 1 stick butter  
– melted
- 2 cups graham cracker crumbs

#### FILLING

- ¾ cup sugar
- 3 (8-oz) pkg. cream cheese  
– brought to room temperature
- 1 (15-oz) can solid-pack pumpkin
- 2 tbsp. all-purpose flour
- 1 tsp. pumpkin pie spice
- ½ tsp. ground ginger
- ½ tsp. ground cinnamon
- 1 tsp. pure vanilla extract
- 2 eggs, lightly beaten

### DIRECTIONS

Preheat oven to 325 degrees. Spray a 13x9x2-inch baking dish with nonstick spray.

In a small bowl, combine cracker crumbs and sugar; stir in butter. Press mixture evenly into the bottom of the baking dish. Cover and refrigerate while you prepare the filling.

In a large bowl, beat cream cheese and sugar until smooth. Beat in the pumpkin, flour, spices and vanilla. Add eggs; beat on low speed just until combined. Pour over crust and smooth the top.

Bake for 35-45 minutes or until center is almost set. Cool on a wire rack for 1 hour. Cover and refrigerate for 8 hours, preferably overnight. Cut cheesecake into bars, arrange on a plate and sprinkle a little cinnamon on top. Makes 20 bars.

## GAMECOCK COACHES TRY TO FIRE UP TEAM BY REFERRING TO SOUTH ALABAMA AS "ALABAMA"

In an effort to keep its players focused after a huge road win at Florida, the South Carolina football staff has been telling the team this week that it's playing Alabama on Saturday.

"We've got to have a tremendous week of practice if we're going to match up with Alabama's athletes," said Lorenzo Ward, the Gamecocks' defensive coordinator. "This is obviously the best team in the country and we'll need to be extremely locked in."

A reporter covering Ward's comments mentioned to the coach that the Gamecocks were actually playing the South Alabama Jaguars this week.

"Well, but Alabama is still part of their name," Ward replied. "They're definitely still Alabama, just the one in the southern part of the state. There's nothing that says we have to formally reference them with the 'South' part of the name. They're both Alabama-ish, so it's the same thing. We're not being untruthful. Is South Alabama in the state of Alabama? OK then, case closed."

## TIGER FANS RIOT AFTER STEVE SPURRIER REFERS TO CLEMSON AS A "PRETTY DARN GOOD SCHOOL"

Clemson University students rioted this week, burning down the student union and two dorms, as well as setting fire to cars and other campus buildings, after USC head coach Steve Spurrier referred to Clemson as a pretty good college.

"From what I understand, the academics at Clemson are pretty darn good," Spurrier said. "Their fans sure seem to love their school. We wish Clemson well other than the one week a year we play them. I admire their coaching staff and appreciate competing against them."

Clemson fans were enraged by Spurrier's comments, and the anger boiled over into violent riots that erupted across the Upstate campus.



"This despicable, sickening individual actually had the gall to refer to us as a 'pretty good' school," sputtered Dave Williams, a Clemson senior who had just fired a Molotov Cocktail into Tillman Hall. "He knows we're way beyond 'pretty good.' This is the most special place in the universe and he knows that. Saying we're a 'pretty good' school is really hitting below the belt. If USC's administrators don't fire him immediately, we're taking this battle to the streets."
