DYLAN THOMPSON

Senior Quarterback



Fitting that Dylan Thompson's last regular season game in a South Carolina uniform comes in the same stadium where he made his second career start and earned a place, however big or small, in USC fans' hearts forever. Sure, he has one more game to go after this one before he takes off his pads and helmet - possibly for the final time - and rides off into the sunset. But this is the one that really matters. A victory in a lowly bowl would be a nice treat for the redshirt senior who has given so much to USC, but this game will go a long way toward determining how Gamecocks fans remember him for years to come. Beat Clemson again, and shortcomings in losses to Missouri, Kentucky, Auburn and Tennessee will be forgiven and forgotten. That's what's on the line for Thompson, a chance to be the latest USC quarterback who never lost to Clemson. At the end of a 6-5 season that hasn't wanted for disappointment, the Gamecocks need this. Thompson needs this. Against Clemson's vaunted defense on a cold day in November, can he deliver?

VEGAS REPORT

As of late Thursday morning, there was still no line out for the game due to the uncertain status of Clemson freshman quarterback Deshaun Watson. Since injuries forced him out of the first quarter of games vs. Louisville and Ga. Tech, the Tigers are 0-6 against the spread in those two games and the four others he didn't play in.

This past Sunday night, The Wynn in Las Vegas opened Clemson as a 4.5-point home favorite over South Carolina. However, the number was taken off the board quickly and hasn't been put back up since then.

The thinking here is that the 4.5-point number was a bit of a hedge by oddsmakers. In other words, if Watson gets ruled out, Clemson is probably going to be a three-point favorite. If Watson's status gets upgraded by Friday afternoon, books will probably move the number closer to six.

The total for 'over/under' bets will probably fall in the low 50s. The 'under' is on a 6-1 run for Clemson.

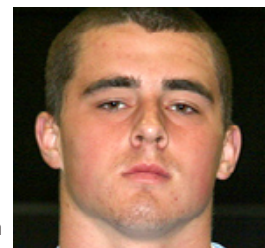

THE BIG FINISH: EASY-TO-MAKE SHRIMP AND SAUSAGE JAMBALAYA

It's hard to believe college football's regular season ends this weekend. Wouldn't it be great if it lasted from Halloween to the Fourth of July? Sounds preposterous, but that's basically how long the NBA season lasts. Of course, eight straight months of college football is impossible for a number of reasons, but selfishly, as a fan, I'd love it if the regular season lasted even a little bit longer.

Hopefully the Gamecocks will finish strong with a win at Clemson on Saturday. Since it's the last regular-season tailgating opportunity, it's only fitting to finish strong there,

too. This easy jambalaya with shrimp and spicy Andouille sausage is just the ticket.

You can use converted rice and cook it in the slow cooker along with all the other jambalaya ingredients, as the recipe directs, but if you want to cook your rice separately the traditional way, in a steamer or pot, and just spoon the jambalaya on top, that works, too. The recipe is from Food Network Magazine, with a few small tweaks. It serves six but could easily be doubled.

SLOW-COOKED ANDOUILLE AND SHRIMP JAMBALAYA

INGREDIENTS

- 1 lb. Andouille or other sausage
 - sliced 1/2-inch thick
- 2 green bell peppers, chopped
- 2 stalks celery, chopped
- 1 sweet onion, chopped
- 1 (28-oz) can diced tomatoes
- 1 cup converted rice (see note)
- 1 1/2 cups chicken broth
- 2 tsp. Creole seasoning
- 2 bay leaves
- 1/2 tsp. dried thyme
- 1/8 tsp. cayenne pepper (optional)
- 1 lb. large shrimp
 - peeled and deveined

DIRECTIONS

Combine all ingredients except the shrimp in a 6-quart slow cooker. Cover and cook on low for 4 hours, adding the shrimp during the last 5 minutes of cooking. Discard the bay leaves, then serve.

Note: If you prefer, omit the converted rice and cook regular rice separately. Serve the jambalaya on top.

DABO SWINNEY REFUSES TO CONFIRM USC RANT HAS ALREADY BEEN WRITTEN

Clemson head coach Dabo Swinney declined to answer when asked during his weekly press conference if he's already written a rant complaining about the University of South Carolina.

The pre-coordinated rant would presumably be delivered to the media next Tuesday afternoon should the Tigers lose to USC for a sixth straight year.

"That's not something I can get into with you," Swinney said. "If I have anything to say about them, it will certainly be off-the-cuff and spontaneous – not pre-planned."

Swinney then pulled out a piece of paper and began reading, "In closing, the one thing I know for sure is that the only team from this state to win a BCS game is in Clemson."

A source inside the Clemson athletic department told the Associated Press he'd seen Swinney practicing a speech in the mirror in his office this week. The speech apparently included the phrase "the real Columbia is in the Ivy League."

CLEMSON RADIO STATION SWITCHES FORMAT TO "ALL DESHAUN WATSON UPDATES"

A Clemson radio station announced this week that it would change formats from country music to "nothing but Deshaun Watson medical updates, 24/7/365."

"Our listeners have spoken, and they've asked us to stop playing Kenny Chesney and Blake Shelton and to start giving them up-to-the-minute updates on Deshaun Watson's medical condition," said Walter Groggins, station manager for 106.3 "The Hayride" in Clemson.

Groggins said the station's staff has begun following Watson around the Clemson campus, reporting live on whether he appears to be limping or walking with a hitch in his step.

"If he trips over a rock or sits down to type a text message, you're going to know it instantly if you're listening to us," he said. "If he uses the bathroom, we'll let you know how long he was in there."

The updates will include information about Watson's meals, including a list of the side dishes and beverages he consumes.

"We were the first to report that he had Chick-fil-A for lunch yesterday, as well as a lemonade," said Groggins. "That's the kind of information you're just not going to be able to find elsewhere."
