OFFENSIVE GUARD

USC has to complete a task that seems nearly impossible in replacing one of the best left guards in the country, A.J. Cann. It's not likely that USC has anyone on the roster that will be able to replicate Cann's production and leadership, but a good player is needed to man that important spot and create some stability. Cody Waldrop has played both guard and center during his time at USC and is currently listed on the depth chart as a starter, a depth chart that is certainly not a set lineup by any means. Redshirt freshman Donell Stanley has done very well since arriving at South Carolina and although he has no in-game experience, has a chance to win the job depending on his play in preseason camp.

Redshirt sophomore quarterback Connor Mitch has to be considered the odds-on favorite to start the season opener against North Carolina, but can you ever really truly predict the winner of a quarterback battle when it involves Steve Spurrier? Spurrier has shown that he's not scared to go against the grain and start the quarterback who he thinks gives the best chance to win, regardless of what the common perception is on who the starter should be. What do we know at this point? Mitch had a good spring and finished it off with a good spring game. He's got the ability to get the job done, but obviously lacks experience at this time. Perry Orth might be a walk-on, but he's an extremely hard worker and probably knows the offense better than anyone on the team. We all know that Spurrier wants his quarterback to be an extension of him and we know that Spurrier likes Orth a great deal, so can he truly be counted out? Probably not. Freshman Lorenzo Nunez also brings a different element to the position as the best athlete the Gamecocks have at quarterback. BRANDON WILDS

Running back Brandon Wilds enters his final season in the South Carolina program with the opportunity to put up big numbers. While Wilds will share the backfield with redshirt sophomore David Williams and, to a lesser extent, fellow senior Shon Carson, the Gamecocks' question mark at quarterback should mean Wilds is handed the football plenty in 2015. Not very highly recruited out of high school, Wilds has shown he belongs at the SEC level, though nagging injuries and sharing the rock with running backs like Marcus Lattimore and Mike Davis has kept him from having a true All-SEC level season. Wilds ranks 28th on Carolina's all-time rushing list with 1,277 yards on 256 carries. Also an excellent receiver and solid pass protector, Wilds should be in line to start and have a career year for the Gamecocks.

BRANDON SHELL

A former Rivals100 prospect and Shrine Bowl selection, Shell played a bit in 2011 after recovering from labrum surgery and ended up taking a redshirt. From the 2012 season onward, he's been a fixture for the Gamecocks up front. Shell brings a consecutive games started streak of 35 into the 2015 season. Shell is likely to have plenty of NFL buzz, given his size, athleticism, and NFL bloodlines (nephew of Art Shell). The Goose Creek product has played right tackle for the Gamecocks in prior seasons but Shawn Elliott could move him to the left side this season as USC searches for the best combination within the starting five. Regardless of what side he mans, Shell is the most experienced player on the offensive line for the Gamecocks and will be a big key to the 2015 campaign.
